

GARDEN PEST

UK gardeners are being asked to look out for an invasive insect, the Citrus Longhorn beetle (Anoplophora chinensis), which could harm woodland areas and garden plants. It has been



brought in on plants imported from China and may affect a wide range of trees or shrubs including oak, beech, ash, maple, apple, pear, willow, hibiscus, horse chestnut, hazel, birch, mulberry

and rose. The larval stage of the beetle is the most damaging. The larvae feed internally on the pith and vascular systems of the lower trunk and root. The tunnels created by the feeding leaves trees susceptible to disease and wind damage. The adults can cause more limited damage by feeding on foliage and eating young bark. Adult beetles are large (21-37mm long) and black with variable white markings. their antennae are longer than their bodies (between 1.2 to 2 times) and are black with white/light blue bands.

If you suspect the presence of this pest or see a beetle that you suspect might to be this, trap it if possible, and immediately report your findings to your local DEFRA Plant Health and seeds inspector (PHSI) or PHSI HQ in York.

BONFIRES

Although there are no specific byelaws about bonfires and you are entitled to have a bonfire to dispose of garden waste, you are not entitled to cause a nuisance by having a bonfire.

Your neighbours are entitled to enjoy their homes and gardens. It is an offence under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 to cause a nuisance by burning rubbish. There are environmentally friendly alternatives to bonfires such as using the local council's recycling and composting including the green waste collection service.

If you want to have a bonfire:

- Warn your neighbours, be considerate and polite, perhaps agree on a time for the bonfire
- Burn dry material as it produces less smoke, do not burn freshly cut material
- Do not burn household rubbish, rubber, plastic, paint or foam as they can produce poisonous compounds
- Never use old engine oil, meths or petrol to light the fire
- Look at the weather, smoke hangs in the air when it is still and damp, or will blow into a neighbours garden if it is windy. Hot, sultry days can cause the smoke to linger at low levels
- Remember that your neighbours are more likely to be in their gardens or have windows open if the weather is warm and at weekends and bank holidays.
- Do not leave the fire unattended or smouldering, think about keeping some water nearby to douse if necessary.

If you are being bothered by a bonfire:

- Approach the neighbour, be polite and explain the problem it is causing, try and reach a compromise.
- If the smoke is drifting across the road and is a danger to traffic contact the police
